Congressman Coble,

I met with you in August 2005 to discuss my situation as a former National Health Service Corps provider with RMA and Randolph Hospital.

The enclosed correspondence to Asheboro Police Chief Gary Mason is self-explanatory. It is clear that local measures of oversight are failing me once again. Bob Morrison is an important and influential man. I am merely a doctor who once believed in his "vision".

During our meeting, we discussed how I, as a "medical whistleblower" had fallen through every crack in state and federal oversight – and how the legal system had failed me because "public servants" were allowed to lie with impunity. You spoke of recently-passed federal legislation that will help people who find themselves in similar situations in the future. But as you pointed out, that legislation is too little too late for me.

However, there ARE laws in place now that, if they were enforced, would bring closure and "justice" to my situation. In our meeting, you agreed to assist me in making contact with officials at both the IRS and USDHHS in order to pursue this case. However, it has been nearly six months, and your office has provided no further follow-up.

The recent hullabaloo in Washington and Raleigh regarding ethics and public disclosure (including the fiascos involving Jack Abramoff and Jim Black), as well as the recent scandal in Greensboro regarding Police Chief Wray lend practical example and support to what I have been saying for eight years about "non-profits" and public accountability. The lights and the fan are on. You, as my representative have a responsibility to see this through on my behalf.
